

The new school year is on the way. Start clean.

In the hustle and bustle of everyday operations, your school bus fleet data can become untidy. Clean up fleet data on the backend.

Ensure all vehicles are entered, and disable unused units.

Verify that their information is up to date, including GPS unit and locations.

Ensure driver data is current.

If you use Z Pass™, keep student data up to date.

Confirm forms are signed and filed for each driver performing inspections.

Troubleshoot vehicles having issues.

If you use Zonar Ground Traffic Control™, use the GPS Units Health Report to ensure your fleet is functioning properly.

Revisit inspections and sanitizations.

Resolve unverified or incomplete inspections.

Clear failed inspections.

Identify and resolve defects that show as not being done.

Address unclear or unresolved repair notes.

Identify opportunities to retrain drivers on performing vehicle inspections.

Evaluate inspection and sanitization configurations and protocols to make sure they're relevant.
